

FOUR NEW PASTORS IN CAMDEN PULPITS

DeMaris, who has gone to Long Branch, while Rev. George Archer preached at the Trinity M. E. Church, he succeeding Rev. C. S. Miller, who was assigned to South Amboy.

In all of the other churches the old pastors were received by their respective congregations. Throughout the coming week there will be formal receptions tendered the new and old pastors and their families.
