

ALLEGED POLICY PEOPLE ARRESTED

One of the Most Fruitful Raids in
Years Was Made in Camden
Yesterday

One of the most successful policy raids in years, in Camden, was made under the supervision of Chief of Police Foster yesterday. Sergeant Hyde and squad arrested Thomas F. Waters, alias "Uncle Frank," aged 73 years; Isaac G. Johnson, seven persons, male and female, white and colored, and captured a quantity of drawings, "dream books" and plays, at 257 Division street.

Captain Stanley, sergeant Reeder and squad arrested four women and secured a lot of paraphernalia in a house on Locust near Line street. The alleged proprietor is still at large.

Policeman Sayers arrested Gilbert Massey, aged 70 years, at 727 Sycamore street, on the charge of being a policy writer.

At the hearings before Justice Stackhouse, Waters, Johnson and Massey were committed in default of \$1000 bail each. The witnesses were released. The complaints were made by an agent of the Fidelity Detective Agency.
