Detective Pinkerton, of Philadelphia, in company with County Detectives Smith and Cherry visited a lonely spot near Harleigh Cemetery, Camden, Friday, and following the instructions of a roughly sketched plan, dug \$400 worth of silverware from beneath a tree where it had been secreted after having been stolen from the residence of a Mr. Webster, who lives in a fashionable part of Germantown, Pa.

The detective said yesterday that the plan was furnished by William Dougherty, aged 19 years, under arrest in Atlantic City, and that they believe he is the mysterious "Raffles" who has been looting houses in the fashionable suburbs of Philadelphia.

Harry Adams, aged 27 years, of 245 Division street, is suffering from lockjaw in its worst form, convulsion following convulsion, and according to the attending physician death is but a few hours off. Adams recently had the fingers of his right hand mashed while at work at the coke plant of the Public Service Corporation.

She screamed for help and her father and brother came to her aid and turned the man over to a policeman. When arraigned before Recorder Stackhouse he said he was John Lavin. He claimed that he drank too much and that a friend took him into the house. Recorder Stackhouse committed him to the county jail in default of \$500 bail on a charge of breaking and entering with intent to steal.

Charles Simon, of Philadelphia, a lineman in the employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad, was committed to the county jail by Justice Baldwin, on the charge of attempted assault preferred by Mrs. Kliza J. Scofield, of Mt. Ephraim, N. J., and alleged to have been committed February 6, 1906.
