

LAST OF BANDIT GANG MUST DIE IN CHAIR

PHILADELPHIA, June 17.—Frank M. Doris, last of four men to be tried for the killing of Patrolman Harry M. Cooper during a holdup here May 4, was today found guilty of murder in the first degree with death in the electric chair fixed as the penalty. The jury had deliberated since 3:30 p. m. yesterday.

Patrolman Cooper was shot while pursuing the men after they had held up and robbed a bank messenger carrying \$100,000. The bandits had secured \$80,000 and were attempting to flee in an automobile when a bullet put their machine out of commission. The \$80,000 was recovered from the bandit car.

The other three men captured with Doris were Joseph Curry, Harry Bentley and William Juliano. They were also convicted of murder, their punishment being fixed as death.
