

CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

** A sneak-thief yesterday entered the apartment house at 200 Benson street, and stole \$50 from Francis Bunker's room.

** Prominent fire underwriters in Camden yesterday witnessed a demonstration of the city's water pressure. It gave general satisfaction.

** As Edward Corbett was leaving the county jail yesterday he was arrested by Constable White on a charge of attacking Joseph Ware, an Eighth ward election officer, last Tuesday. Corbett was taken before Justice Rouh, who held him in \$500 bail for court.

** There was a fire up a tree in Camden yesterday, and the local firemen were in a quandry as to how to fight the flames which threatened surrounding dwellings. The tree, located at Newton avenue and Walnut street, was old and dried. Boys built a fire about the base, and some time after the trunk and limbs were afire. The firemen solved the problem by chopping the blazing tree down.

** For three hours yesterday traffic was held up on the West Jersey and Seashore Railroad in Camden by two horses which, escaping from their stable, became fastened in the trestle bridge over Line Ditch. It was finally found necessary to get out the railroad's wrecking crew, which raised the horses by block and tackle.
