** The Camden county grand jury yesterday made a presentment of nineteen true bills.

** Wilmer Henry, 22 years old, of 817 Lipe street, accidentally shot himself in the leg yesterday.

** At a session of the Naturalization Court yesterday eight persons were admitted to citizenship.

** The Third Regiment, National Guard, will hold its annual field day next Thursday on the lawn at Haddon and Kalgho avenues.

** William Brock, sentenced to five years; William Miller, to one year, and Henry Selby for one year, were taken to Trenton yesterday.

** County Collector Ivins yesterday forwarded to the Board of Education a check for \$24,450.25, the city proportion of the State school money.
