

LANDED HIS MAN AFTER A STRUGGLE

Harry Livermore and John Mares were arrested in Camden yesterday charged with breaking into the Pennsylvania Bottling and Supply Company's place at 14 Market street. The complaint was made by Henry E. Nunnieb, manager of the company.

Policeman Kappel says he found the men in the place. He succeeded in arresting Mares, but Livermore got away. Later in the day Policemen Harry Miller and Isaac Toy visited Livermore's home at Third and Clinton streets with a warrant for his arrest issued by Recorder Stackhouse. Livermore eluded the officers and, amid much excitement, scurried away over fences. He was once more found by Miller, but put up such a stout resistance that the officer pulled his revolver. Officer and prisoner rolled about in each other's embrace until the former finally succeeded in mastering the man.

Policeman Miller was seriously cut during the primary election fight July 28 last and yesterday was his second day of duty.
