

SISTER WOULDN'T ARREST BROTHER

So Detective Accused the Latter
of Assault and With In-
tent to Kill

On a warrant sworn out by County Detective Smith, Marshall Ridge, of Omaha, Neb., was yesterday held in bail by Justice Schmitz, in Camden, on the charge of assaulting, with intent to kill, his sister, Mrs. Josephine Wilson, at 304 Mickle street. The parties are heirs of the late Dr. J. M. Ridge, who was one of Camden's best-known physicians. According to the officer, some property belonging to the estate was advertised to be sold next Tuesday. The brother went to his sister, who is the administratrix of her father's estate, and asked for some money to prevent the sale of the property. The sister refused, when, it is alleged, a quarrel ensued, resulting in the shooting, which, however, proved harmless.

Dr. O. B. Gross, a friend of the family, was summoned, and he succeeded in settling the differences between Mr. Ridge and his sister, who finally advanced the money to prevent the sale of the property, and went her brother's bail. Declining to cause her brother's arrest, the case was reported to the Prosecutor's office, which acted in the matter.
