

BURGLARS IN CAMDEN.

POLICE CAPTURE TWO, WHO ARE COMMITTED TO A WAIT TRIAL.

Forecast of the Municipal Contest for Councilmen—A Cracker Baker in the Sheriff's Hands—Odds and Ends.

Edward, alias "Eve," Biddle, Walter Davis and Daniel Powell were committed to jail in default of \$500 bail each by Mayor Pratt yesterday for robbing the house of Peter, Wolverton, 1103 Cresson street, on Tuesday last. Biddle confessed and told where the goods were pawned. He said that Powell broke into the house and then left Davis in by the front door while he kept guard outside. They pawned the goods in this city.

The present outlook is that there will be perfect harmony throughout Camden in the Republican ranks, and the following candidates will be named: First ward, the present incumbent, J. Leyton Wescott; Second ward, Freeholder, Cooper B. Hatch will succeed John Campbell; James H. Lane will be renominated and re-elected in the Third; Maylon F. The present indications are that License Commissioner Fury will be the next Councilman from the Eighth ward.
